SUBJECT: Damascus Media Reaction: Syria/China, Iraq,

Palestinian territories, Saudi Arabia (6/18-20)

1. Overview: President Asad's visit to China was the main focus in the Syrian press. All papers featured a statement by Chinese FM to the Syrian Arab News Agency in which he attached great importance to the visit and rejected US sanctions on Syria.

The tense situation in Iraq continued to be a major theme in the Syrian papers which headlined the visit of a US Codel to Baghdad and featured a statement by a senior US diplomat who revealed that more than 150 members of the US Embassy in Baghdad will serve as advisers to the Iraqi authority.

Events in the occupied territories were another press topic. Syrian papers reported EU leaders' refusal to recognize any change in the 1967 borders as stated in the final communique

issued at the end of EU summit in Brussels. On (6/20) papers UNCLASSIFIED reported Israeli firing on a UN car carrying three British MPs in Rafah.

On (6/20) the lead item in Al-Ba'th was the Saudi forces' killing of Abdul-Aziz al-Muqren, leader of Al-Qaeda in the Gulf in the wake of the killing of the US hostage.

Editorially, most Syrian commentators focused on President Asad's visit to China and on Iraq. Dr. Haydar Haydar in Al-Thawra commented on the results of a US-supervised opinion poll in Iraq which purportedly indicated that the majority of Iraqis reject US occupation. Haydar said that "Iraqis know very well that the rule of the tyrant was replaced by a new kind of colonialism." Riad Zein in Syria Times criticized the designation of 150 US diplomats in the US Embassy in Baghdad to serve as advisers in Iraqi ministries describing them as "mercenaries" who will be used as "tools to sabotage the interests of the Iraqi people and to preserve US hegemonist interests."

Among items of interest in the regional papers is an article in Al-Hayat reporting that the majority of Syrian MPs have signed a draft law that would impose sanctions on the US. An article in As-Safir reported that Syria has handed over to France an Algerian Islamic suspect linked to Al-Qaeda, Sa'id `Aarif. As-Safir also carried an article which denied earlier reports that Vice President Khaddam intends to resign.

## 3. Editorial Commentary:

"America, a Torch for Civilization or a Pickax of Destruction"

Dr. Haydar Haydar, a commentator in government-owned Al-Thawra, commented (6/18): "Results of the US-supervised poll in Iraq were disappointing for Bush and Blair. Neither the claims about the weapons of mass destruction nor the allegations of freeing Iraq from a corrupt dictatorial regime succeeded in turning the eyes of the Iraqis away from the real reasons for the war...

"The US Administration failed to find a connection between Al-Qa'ida and Saddam's regime...

"The Iraqi people are resisting occupation using all.

possible means. The preachers of democracy and human rights UNCLASSIFIED failed the test after the Abu Ghurayb scandals. Facts prove the involvement of Halliburton and its brokers in the US Administration, and American investigation committees reveal new information about 'intimate relations' between Administration officials and the well-known company...

"Oil was the reason behind the war on Iraq... Democracy, human rights, saving people from poverty, and curbing Israel's aggressive onslaught are the last things on the mind of the American neoconservative leaders and their allies in Britain.

"The results of the recent poll show that the picture is very clear to Iraqis who know very well that the rule of the tyrant was replaced by a new kind of colonialism, and a vicious face by a false mask."

"Bush, between Criticism and Calls to Replace Him"

Ahmad Dawwa, a commentator in government-owned Al-Thawrah, commented (6/18): "The criticism of Bush's foreign policy by a group of US diplomats and military politicians from the Republican and Democratic parties just few months prior to the presidential race is caused by their feeling of the danger this policy poses to the American people...

"The new message indicates that the US Administration ignores US protests and sticks to its policy, which results in more mistakes.

"Those who pin hope on a US role to find a solution to the struggle in the region should read this message carefully and should stop making useless concessions."

"The International Criminal Court Once Again"
Fouad Mardoud, chief editor of government-owned Syria Times, commented (6/20): "Should an international war crimes tribunal be convened to try U.S. soldiers and agents? There is ample evidence of heinous crimes against Iraqis and many other nationals detained in U.S. detention camps. Only yesterday, a U.S. human rights group accused the Pentagon and the CIA of establishing more than 20 detention camps in

many countries around the world -- half of them are unknown. Also on Friday, the Pentagon announced the death of an Iraqi prisoner at Abu Ghraib prison in Iraq, claiming that the death 'was natural.' In establishing those prisons and torturing civilians, the American soldiers and agents clearly violated conventions on the laws of war...

"The U.N. Security Council, which is debating the case, should responsibly address the international worries over the exemption of U.S nationals from the ruling of that international tribunal. The Council needs to resist U.S. pressure and attempts to put Americans above international law...\_"

"Spies" Riad Zein, an analyst in government-owned Syria Times, wrote (6/20): "A senior American diplomat said more than 150 members of the US Embassy in Baghdad...will be 'advisers' to the Iraqi authority. The diplomat said 'vigilant and watchful' members of the Embassy staff will be 'consultants' at Iraqi ministries, 'giving advises' [sic] to officials of the ministries and to the US Ambassador on choosing projects as regards re-building [sic] Iraq, on how to steer financial aid and how to protect the wealth of Iraq... "It should however be recalled that the US-designed 'Iraq rebuilding program' is directly supervised by the Pentagon through the US Embassy. The forthcoming ill-famed Ambassador John Negroponty will control the USD.18.5-billion-fund program. Any re-building project whatsoever will be carried out only with the approval of the Embassy. The projects hence are understood to serve the interests of the US and not to protect the wealth of Iraq. The mercenaries have been used as tools to sabotage the interests of the Iraqi people and to preserve the hegemonist interests of their masters... " SCOBEY
