SUMMARY: The political situation emerging in the aftermath of Punjab Governor Taseer's assassination dominated Pakistani newspapers today. Media highlighted statements of PPP leaders labeling the assassination a "political murder," and pointing fingers at the PML-N-led administration in Punjab for a "criminal security lapse." Other articles show that not everyone condemns the assassination; for example there were reports that a group of lawyers in Islamabad showered flower petals on the suspected killer in a show of support. Some religious groups pledged to support the

suspected killer and several prominent Punjabi clerics refused to  $\overline{\mathrm{UNCLASSIFIED}}$ lead funeral prayers for the slain Governor, either out of contempt for Mr. Taseer or fear of possible backlash from fanatics. Secretary Clinton's meeting with Pakistani Ambassador Haqqani and her condolence message also received extensive coverage. All major newspapers penned editorials analyzing the root causes and implications of the assassination. However, the Urdu and English dailies are divided in their approaches. Most of the vernacular papers implied that the Governor was to blame for his own murder, as his "careless" remarks on the blasphemy law brought on his violent demise, whereas the English language papers expressed concerns over rising extremism and intolerance in Pakistan. The pro-Taliban Jihadi Urdu daily "Islam" warned that the Governor Taseer's assassination should not be used as a pretext to unleash propaganda against Pakistan's Islamic laws. On the other hand, the prestigious "Dawn," worried that "the war to define Pakistan is not just being fought between the 'liberal' and 'conservative,' but between the ultra-conservatives and everyone else." The "Daily Times," which was owned by Taseer, was adamant that some sections of the media were complicit in inciting hate against him.

In other stories, media gave prominent coverage to the "positive and fruitful" talks between the Pakistani Foreign Ministry and the visiting High Council for Peace from Afghanistan that could have a "far reaching impact in strengthening the bilateral relations." The two parties discussed holding direct talks with the Taliban as well as a joint Pakistan-Afghanistan grand jirga. The populist English daily "The News," maintained that Pakistan has agreed to a request from Afghanistan to play a role in the reconciliation process, whereas the right-wing, sensational nationalist English daily "The Nation" reported that Pakistan "seeks" joint efforts for Afghan security. Most dailies also carried the announcement that Acting SRAP Frank Ruggiero will arrive in Islamabad today to reaffirm the U.S. commitment to the people of Pakistan. END SUMMARY.
