

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



On 19 Jul 04, this investigation was initiated based upon receipt of a Memorandum of Transmittal (0083-04-CID789) from the 75th Military Police Detachment, Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, IZ, wherein Mrange eported he was abused while detained at a detention facility in Al-Habbaniyah, IZ.

Investigation established there was insufficient evidence to prove or disprove the listed offenses. Mr. Was interviewed and claimed he was captured by U.S. Coalition Forces and taken to Al-Habbaniyah, IZ and during his detention he had two bags over his head for fourteen days, was beat in the stomach and kidney, hit on the lips, and thrown into concertina wire. Interviews of the relevant medical personnel and review of Mr. Market and medical records make no medical observations, which would indicate or suspect abuse. This investigation did not produce any viable subjects and interviews of the Camp Al-Habbaniyah/Camp Manhattan facility related they had not seen anyone abuse Mr. Was or any abuse to other detainees. The conduct of this investigation did not further diminish the integrity or credibility of Mr. allegations.



DETAILS

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: On 23 Jun 04, the 504th Military Intelligence (MI) Brigade (BDE). Joint Interrogation and Debriefing Center (JIDC), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghruyeb, Iraq (AGI), reported that Detainee National Detainee NFI, alleged he was abused while detained by Coalition Reporting System (NDRS) Forces (CF) at Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), prior to his arrival at BCCF, AGI.

About 1100, 23 Jun 04, this office received a statement written by SSG A Co. 202nd MI Battalion (BN), JIDC, BCCF, AGI, detailing allegations. (See Statement) 66-1,676-1

About 2030, 23 Jun 04, SA interviewed SSG regarding the statement he provide this office. He related that this was his 2nd interview with the part and no other interrogations were conducted with the before that time. He stated that was detailed in Habbaniya for 14 days, then at an unknown Marine facility until his arrival at BCCF. He stated that while questioning about information he provided on 12 May 04. he gave the information only because we was beaten. SSG recorded the allegations in his previous statement and did not exploit the allegations further. SSG alleged that his abuse occurred at HABBANIYA, which was 20 days before the information, for which he claims he was tortured to give.

with the assistance of Linguist About 1500, 26 Jun 04, SA who provided a sworn statement. (See Sworn Statement and Translation of interviewed Iragi Statement) 66-1,276-1

About 1900, 5 Jul 04, SA reviewed detainee file and determined that he was captured on 4 Apr 04 by "B 1/9 CAV". He was transferred to BCCF on 17 May 04. A medical Screening record, date 4 Apr 04, noted several scars on the detainee's head and arms, but made no mention of abuse allegations. The intelligence report mentioned by SSG was located and verified to be dated 12 May 04. A review of Magistrates Database revealed captured by "1MEF". (See Detainee File)

About 1500, 8 Jul 04, SA obtained a copy of the physical report from CPT (DR) 391st MP BN, Detainee Aid Station (DAS), AGI, BCCF. DR. he found no signs of injury. (See Physical Report)

TRANSLATION OF STATEMENT PROVIDED BY DETAINER

NDRS

I was arrested at 4:00 AM, in my house located in Alanbar province, Alkhaledeyya, Ghazwan Island. They took me to Alhabbaneya prison on 4 Apr 04. They started torturing me from the first day, and it continued for eleven days by the guards after midnight, and I was beaten on all my body, and there are scars on my body so far. One day a white tall American, 180cm, and he weighs 90 kg, talking broken Arabic, came and said to me, "I would kill your healthy kidney", after he knew that my other kidney is sick and I have a stone in it, and he was training himself in hitting the area of my healthy kidney while he was in his shift.

Q: Can you describe to us any of the other guards in the prison?

A: One of them was short and has muscles, he was almost 160 cm, and I was beaten by four white persons.

Q: How did they torture you as you told us?

A: Hitting by a stick and kicking by boots and punching by hands in the area of my kidney, and all my body.

Q: How long was the torture?

A: From one to two hours.

Q: Where did they beat you?

A: Outside, and there was a fence of bare wires and they threw me three times on the wires.

Q: Were you tortured since the end of the first eleven days in the prison?

A: No

Q: Do you want to add any thing to this statement?

A: No.

At 1505, 27 Oct 04, the undersigned coordinated with CW3 502nd Military Intelligence (MI) Battalion (BN), Camp Victory, Iraq (IZ), who related he believed the units described in the NCIS email, 503rd and 506th, were elements of the 82nd Airborne who had operated in that area and not Tactical HUMINT teams. He believed the area had been turned over to the Marines around the time of capture (4 Apr 04). CW3 for eviewed the Tactical Interrogation Report, TIR IMEF HET11 0319 04, dated 12 May 04, wherein Mr later related he was tortured into giving up the names, and determined the interrogation had been conducted by the Marines HUMINT Exploitation Team 11 (HET 11). CW3 conducted a query of the databases of the 502nd MI BN but could not find any additional information concerning this incident or identify interrogators of Mr CW3 related the 312th MI BN, located in the CAV, area may have additional information which may assist in this investigation.

At 1145, 5 Nov 04, the undersigned coordinated with SSG (1997), 312th MI BN, Camp Victory, IZ, who conducted a records query concerning Mr related there were no records of members of the 312th MI BN interrogating Mr but he noted his records started on 12 Apr 04 and Mr but had been captured on 4 Apr 04.

Agent's Comment: SSG related they had taken over and received records from their predecessors, the 501st MI BN, 1st Infantry Division (1ID), Germany; but the record keeping was poor and tracking and documenting of detainee information was not done or done improperly.



I arrived at Camp Habinayah (aslo known as Camp Manhattan) as an individual replacement for 1-34 Armor on approximately 1 April 2004. At this time, 1-34 was running a small detention facility and was working with Brigade to determine what the fate of the facility would be. The Battalion Commander, LTC and add not want a detention facility on his base, saying that he did not have the manpower or the trained personnel to effectively run the center. The S1, CPT and a was the OIC for the detention facility, as well as performing his other duties as Adjutant. About a week after my arrival, I was tasked to take over the OIC position for the detention center, my formal designation being S1A. The SOP when I arrived was confusing and put together in a piecemeal fashion. It was written when the unit first arrived in country, and was proving fairly ineffective: without an NCOIC or OIC permenantly assigned to the facility, the Sergeants of the Guard (who would rotate) had little continuity. The guards themselves were taken from different units, one day from the cooks, another from the mechanics, and so on. A few soldiers held permenant shifts (for example, SGT was always the SOG between the hours of 1600 and 2400), but otherwise the personnel on each shift was different from easy to day. When I was assigned to OIC, a SFC was assigned as my NCOIC and SSG (USMC) was transferred from Falluja as a detention facility specialist. Our first priorty was to rewrite the SOP in accordance with 1st MEF, our parent unit that had just taken over our AO from the 82nd Airborne Division. At this time, the incidents at Abu Ghraib were becoming public in the world media which obviously caught the attention of the chain of command. I, along with my NCOs, took this opportunity to make changes to the informal SOP, such as taking off detainee's hoods and unbinding their hands when they were placed in the concertina wire enclosed area. We also began briefing each guard shift about the appropriate use of force and when to apply it; SSG held training sessions about how to handle detainees and a few basic commands in Arabic. These changes and the rewriting of the SOP were being introduced around the last week of April 04. One of the changes in the SOP that came from higher was the insistence that no detainee be held in our facility longer than 48 hours. When I arrived, certain detainees would be kept for up to three weeks, but our unit become more regular in their convoys to Camp Junction City in Ramadi (Brigade Headquarters) so that we could move detainees out much faster. I would always escort the detainees on these convoys; on 9 May 04 my 5 ton was struck by an ED, and I was medevaced out of theater. I have since been transferred to 2-34 Armor statesidem, here at Fort Riley.

During my first week or so as OIC for the detention facility, I watched the way operations were conducted and made little changes. At the time, I heard rumors of past mistreatment of detainees. After those initial conversations, I did not hear any rumors about such conduct during my time there -- perhaps because, once I was in charge, such things were kept from me. I was often present during the day at the facility, and would try to check on the facility once during the middle of the night. The unit had, in the past, removed certain soldiers from guard duty because they seemed too aggressive, but I did not have the sense that any of my guards during the month of April had those tendencies -- but, then again, I was new to the unit and could not recognize many of the faces

of my guards; I probably had 40 different personnel as guards during my time there.

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

I am assigned to 1-34 AR BN, on the 27th of FEB, 2004 I deployed to Iraq and was stationed with my battalion that was already in Iraq since Sep 03. I was stationed out at Camp Manhatten, Iraq. There was a detention facility at the camp that was being run by the Battalion. The OIC of the detention facility was CPT when I arrived in country. On the 5th of March I was place as a primary SOG for the 1600 - 2400 hrs. shift at the detention raemy (EPW site). During the times of my shift I had detaniees arrive that looked beaten and were bleeding. This I would notice when the units dropped off the detainees at the facility. Several different units dropped off detainees. I aslo witnessed several detainees fall off of vehicles when they were dropped off at the different units dropped off detainees. I asso witnessed several detainees rail off of venicles when they were dropped off at the detainees for items that they had in there pockets and placed them in plastic bags, during this we also placed detainee numbers on a piece of engineer tape and tied it to there wrist and placed new zip cuffs if there hands were not cuffed in front of their body or if the cuffs were to tight. There was only 2 members of the unit allowed to enter the EPW yard to cut down the confussion, meaning that when units dropped off deteainees we would only allow them to use two soldiers to physically escort the detainee into the facility. From the end of March to the end of April I only came across 1 detainee that complained about his right shoulder, the detainees name was and also told the guard to radio centrian x-ray of send a medic to the EPW. The guard that reported it to myself was SPC. 1/34 AR). During that time I had a detainee passout in the front yard and the medic was treating him and came to find out may the detainee was dehydrated and the medic started an IV at that time and the detainee was under observation. That was pretty much it. I did however, establish guidlines for the guards on shift under my command. I basically briefed them on normal common curteousy for handling the detainees and ensured that if they ever witnessed any harm done to any detainees or if they encountered any problems with detainees to come to me for assistance.

Was there basic guidlines on how the detainees were inprocessed when they arrived to the facility?

A: Before the Marines came in to assist with setting up an SOP to govern the operations at the facility, we were basically just having either the guards or the SOG screen the detainees when they arrived at the detention facility. This would include receiving the detainees, contacting medics for the new detainees to be screened upon entering the facility. If the medics did not respond, the detainees would be checked by the guards and SOG then assigned EPW Identification numbers on tags (to include their name and the name of the unit who detained the EPW). The detainee then would be placed either in a holding cell or in the outside area of the facility, which was enclosed by concertina wire.

I served as the personnel officer for Task Force 1-34 AR at Camp Manhattan, Iraq from September 2003 till July 2004. One of my additional duties was to administratively process all detainees taken by units in the Task Force. The Task Force had a Counter Intelligence (CI) team from 312 Military Intelligence at Fort Hood attached to us, which conducted all screenings and initial interrogations of detainees at our base camp. The process of capturing and processing detainees was something that was not trained for prior to our deployment and it took time to develop effective SOPs for our facility. We had no school-trained soldiers who were knowledgeable in the establishment of a detainee facility. We relied heavily on the experience of the CI team to provide guidance on the proper way to handle detainees. We established a holding facility on the base eamp and provided soldiers from throughout the Task Force to pull guard on them while they were at the base camp. These guards primarily came from our Headquarters company (cooks, support personnel, staff personnel). Based on the reason they were captured, a detained would stay with us for a few days up to a few weeks. They were provided water. humanitarian rations, and a place to sleep. The CI team had responsibility for dealing directly with detainees and the guards only had responsibility for securing the facility and only had encounters with detainees under the direction of the CI team. My job was to ensure that detainees were administratively processed. This included in-processing them when they arrived and ensuring they were properly released or transported to another facility if necessary. To in-process a detainee, we would ensure the capturing unit filled out sworn statements on the reason they were detained, we would inventory all evidence and personal effects, and have our medical platoon conduct a medical screening of the detainee. Once in-processed, the CI team conducted all screenings and interrogations. Their purpose was to determine if the detainee needed to be sent higher for further interrogation or prosecution, to gain actionable intelligence for the task force, or to release them based on lack of evidence or actionable intelligence. I was not personally involved with these screening or interrogations operations and focused primarily on the administration of the facility. The CI team had sole responsibility for this. On average, I would spend no more than an hour or two a day at the facility to ensure paperwork was in order. I was always on call whenever a detainee came in and either my NCOIC or I would go in-process them. We continually worked on SOPs to improve the facility and in the early summer we were assigned a USMC corrections specialist to ensure we were in compliance with Coalition Joint Task Force (CJTF) and 1st Marine Division (MARDIV) SOPs on the handling of detainees. We also assigned a LT to work specifically as the OIC of the facility in May to help ensure that standards were being maintained. During my time at Camp Manhattan, I never saw any abuse of detainees by either guards or CI personnel. CI personnel would use various interrogations methods as outlined by CJTF guidance, to include stress positions and various questioning methods, but it never crossed the line into abuse. During our time in Iraq we had visits by personnel in the 82nd Airborne and 1st MARDIV to conduct inspections of our operations and we used their feedback to Q, SA by b (1-1) b 76-1

- Q. Were any of the detainee's that were present when you arrived, those that may have been held for longer than 72 hours, seen by the medics prior to them leaving the facility for the next facility?
- A. Let me see, We used to have a medic on 24 hours, that was SOP. Most of the occasions while I was there they would have been checked out by the medic.
- Q. Is there a possibility, during the time when you came over from Operations to the detainee facility, that a detainee might not have been checked out by a medic that was maintained by the facility prior to his leaving for the next facility?

A. I don't know.



SPC want to make the following statement under oath: I deployed to Iraq with HHC 1-34 AR/ 1BCT in September of 2003. We started taking prisoners, approximately, sometime in September and my section, S-3, starting giving up soldiers for prisoner guard duty at the same time. I am unable to give any exact schedules for the guard duty, as everything changed week to week. Guard shift usually lasted 4-8 hours, though, and there was almost always at least one NCO and four soldiers. There would be more guards if the number if prisoners demanded it. During the course of my prison guard duty I did not witness any soldier of 312 MI strike any prisoners, nor would I have had the opportunity to witness such an event as the interrogations were always done in separate rooms away from the guards. The only unusual thing I ever saw the 312 MI soldiers do was play loud music to keep the prisoners from sleeping. The guards were also ordered to assist in preventing the prisoners from sleeping. The sleep deprivation ended, though, when the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force took control of our brigade, as did carrying weapons on guard, and preventing prisoners from talking and passing information. The prisoners were always treated humanely. Anytime a prisoner had a headache, stomachache, or any kind of ailment we immediately had to call for a medic to come examine them. We often joked they had the best healthcare system in Iraq. Also, on days that our battalion was running low on water and us soldiers had to conserve it the prisoners still had to have as much water as they could drink. As for HHC 1-34 soldiers on guard, I never saw any of them strike or abuse a prisoner. Although, their was plenty of complaining about having to take a never ending procession of prisoners to the latrine. 66-1,676-1

The DATA consist of 7 CID agents. 1 Agent in Charge; 1 Senior Investigative Agent (Asst. Agent in Charge); 5 investigating agents (1 of which is a Warrant Officer). We presently have 72 open investigations. Five are Significant Data Files (SDF), and the remainders are Reports of Investigations (ROI). Of those ROIs, 5 pertain to U.S. Marines and 2 pertain to Naval Seals. We are required to provide a weekly update every Saturday to CID Command. The briefs are then provided on the hill in DC. Each update has to have current investigative activity within the present 7 day reporting period (Sunday - Saturday). We get reports via CID command, Abu Ghraib, the various Detention Facilities in the area, and from various units themselves. The primary efforts are trying to track people/units down. A lot are active duty, and reserves. Once they rotate out of country and return to their various locations, it then becomes a little tasking trying to locate the person/unit. At the present time, the only cases we have not been able to provide any valid investigative activity on are the ones noted above. I was informed by my Battalion Operations section that they are effecting coordination with NCIS, above our level, to discuss what you and I talked about, referring investigations. I am still awaiting a response.






