WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

My name is [redacted]. I am assigned to [redacted]. My MOS is 42L Sr. Administrative Specialist. I've been here for about five months. I spent one month in Taji. I have guarded at the RPC facility about 4 times. When I guard it's from noon to six. I only guard when [redacted] has somebody here. I make sure the detainees get to use the latrine. We take them to the latrine and back. We make sure they're not talking back and forth. We make sure the gate gets open for people to come in. We sign in people that aren't normally here, like the Sergeants that don't work here, but get chow. There's not much to it. I've never been here when the detainees had breakfast, lunch or dinner. It's never struck me as odd that at noon, that I've never seen them have lunch. I've never worked any hours but twelve to six. When a detainee had to use the latrine, they would say, "Sir, mister," You'd find out what they want or need. You'd hand your weapon to someone, unlock the door, and escort them out. Someone would be sitting outside on guard, to you your back, while you're watching them use the latrine. They wash their hands with water, and then we bring them back in. I've never been in here when they've been in processed. I believe they're given two blankets, water, and then meals. I'm authorized to give them a fresh bottle of water. Usually the NCO will be with the interrogator, and at the time he'll get them. All I do is mark his number off on the board from where he was, and I put him on the interrogation room board. I have been on guard when they've come back from an interrogation. The longest time a guy's been in an interrogation, while I've been on watch is roughly 20 minutes. I've never seen a person in any unusual discomfort after an interrogation. There's no indication that any detainees have been abused. Worst I've seen, their handcuffs, they try to pull them up too far, and they'll get cuts, and we bandage them, or loosen up the handcuffs. They're handcuffed constantly as far as I know. When we take them to the latrine, we'll undo one handcuff so they can wash. As far as I know they're handcuffed all the time in their cell. Some are metal handcuffs and some are zip ties Sir. They're like that all the time except when they go to the latrine. I don't know of any instance that a detainee was kicked or punched. I've not seen any abusive behavior by the guards. The detainees don't usually like to keep on the facemasks sometimes, but not they're really hostile. They are not required to keep the facemasks on all the time. But when we take them the latrine we put them on. But in the cell they're not always on. An Ass chewing by my Drill Sergeant in basic training was more aggressive than the way interrogators talk to detainees. I've heard people tell detainees not to talk between each other. I can't hear anything outside the interrogation room. Smoking isn't allowed inside the building. I don't know of a rule that no one can smoke in the interrogation room. *Nothing further*
