CHANGE 1 TO 1ST MARINE DIVISION DETENTIONS SOP

Ref: (a) 1st MarDiv Detainee SOP

The following changes to Ref (a) are effective upon receipt of this document.

- 1. Corpsmen are sufficient for conducting the following:
 - a. Entrance medical check (still to be done immediately upon in-processing of a new detainee).
 - b. Daily medical check of detainees
 - c. Pre and post interrogation medical check.
 - d. Daily hygiene inspection of the detention facility.
 - e. Corpsmen will call a Medical Officer, Physicians Assistant, or Independent Duty Corpsmen (IDC) in any case that requires immediate attention or which is beyond their medical abilities.
- 2. A physician is required to
 - a. Counter-sign the entrance checks, pre/post interrogation checks, and all Corpsman notes on daily faculty inspections and daily detained checks.
 - b. Conduct release physicals.
- 3. The intent of the pre/post interrogation medical check remains: "to verify the general health and physical condition of a detainee (note bruises, cuts, welts, etc before and after the detainee has left the direct custody of the detention facility staff").
- 4. The RCT/BCT commander retains <u>ABSOLUTE</u> authority to control access to his facility and to stop any activity he deems to be improper. Unit S-2 officers have details on classified information regarding interrogation procedures and rules for non Divisional assets, and should be consulted to avoid confusion at the facility.
- 5. The authority to employ Riot Control Agents (RCA) has been delegated to RCT/BCT commanders for use at detention facilities. The OIC of each facility is authorized to employ RCA to deal with detained situations where use of RCA is deemed necessary.
