[redacted] was interviewed at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba by Det. [redacted] FBI Task Force Officer. Also present during the interview was SA [redacted] Air Force Office of Special Investigations and [redacted] language translator. [redacted] was informed of the nature of the interview and the identity of the interviewing agents. The results of the interview are as follows:

[redacted] said he would be willing to talk to the interviewers and answer questions. The reason he refused to speak during his last interview was because he was in a "mood". He would not be more specific regarding this mood.

[redacted] was told that he would be asked questions regarding his past association with another person in the camp. He said that he was responsible for himself and not for others. Others know more about their story than he does.

[redacted] was shown a photograph of [redacted] and was asked if he recognized the person in the photo. [redacted] said the person in the photo was [redacted]. When asked to provide further details about [redacted] he replied that he had forgotten everything [redacted] and did not remember [redacted]. He suggested that the interviewers bring [redacted] into the room and ask him these questions.

[redacted] was reminded that he had given specific information in the past about [redacted]. He replied that any information or accusatory remarks he provided about [redacted] in the past was to get himself out of trouble at the Bagram Air Base. He was being accused by the authorities [redacted] and he believed he would be tortured if he did not agree to the accusations. [redacted] has never been tortured since being taken into custody in Pakistan. He denied knowing how to or ever trying to [redacted].
