I'm a member of Amnesty International, a worldwide voluntary organization which seeks to promote the observance of intenational human rights standards.

I want to express concern about reports that detainees at Bagram are being subjected to torture and other cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment and i urge You to carry out a full, independent investigation into the allegations.

I urge You to ensure that all prisoners at Bagram have access to representatives from the ICRC.

I want to express concern about the high number of suicide attempts among detainees in the Camp Delta detention facility at Guantáname Bay, Cuba and I urge You to carry out a full, independent investigation.

I want to express concern about the transfer of Bisher Al-Rawi and Jamil Al-Banna from Gambia to Bagram in January this year without being granted access to legal counsel, family members or the courts and despite the fact that a habeas corpus petition was pending in the courts, I ask for clarification as to the reasons for their transfer.

I urge You to carry out a full investigation into the alleged intimidation of Bisher Al- Rawi and Jamil Al-Banna by US agents during interrogation at Banjul.
