A DISAGREEMENT BETWEEN FINANCE MINISTER PAUL MARTIN AND INDUSTRY MINISTER ALLAN ROCK OVER PARTY MEMBERSHIP RULES ERUPTED INTO A VERBAL BRAWL ON MONDAY. OVER THE WEEKEND, MARTIN LOYALISTS IN ONTARIO PASSED A RULE MAKING IT HARDER TO RECRUIT NEW PARTY MEMBERS.
