1. (C) SUMMARY: PRM PDAS RICH GREENE MET WITH ICRC OFFICIALS MAY 19 IN PREPARATION FOR THE JUNE 3-4 ICRC DONOR SUPPORT GROUP IN BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA. THE FIVE-HOUR SESSION WAS STRUCTURED AROUND TWO MAIN THEMES: THE U.S.-ICRC RELATIONSHIP, INCLUDING MEDIA HANDLING OF THAT RELATIONSHIP, AND THE ISSUES LIKELY TO DOMINATE THE ICRC DONOR MEETING, INCLUDING NEW SECURITY CHALLENGES. OFFICIALS ALSO DISCUSSED UPCOMING CHANGES TO THE ICRC WASHINGTON OFFICE AND ICRC'S INTEREST IN WEAPONS-CONTROL ISSUES, INCLUDING THOSE LINKED TO BIO-TECHNOLOGY. GREENE NOTED THAT THE U.S. WORKS CLOSELY AND PRODUCTIVELY WITH ICRC DELEGATIONS IN HUMANITARIAN CRISES AROUND THE WORLD AND WE HAVE GREAT RESPECT FOR THEIR OPERATIONAL AND NORMATIVE ROLES.

8. (SBU) ICRC LAWYERS PETER HERBEY AND FRANCOIS BUGNION JOINED THE GROUP FOR A BRIEF DISCUSSION OF ICRC'S INTEREST IN ARMS CONTROL ISSUES. THE TWO AGREED THAT MORE SUBSTANTIVE DISCUSSION ON ISSUES RELATED TO BIOLOGICAL WEAPONS ISSUES WOULD WAIT UNTIL BWC EXPERTS CAME TO GENEVA IN JUNE. HOWEVER, THEY EXPLAINED THAT THE ICRC INTEREST IN WEAPONS ISSUES DERIVED FROM THE GENEVA CONVENTIONS' (GC) FOCUS ON PROPORTIONALITY AND AVOIDANCE OF HARM TO CIVILIANS. THEY SAID U.S. LANGUAGE INTRODUCED DURING THE DECEMBER 2003 RED CROSS CONFERENCE HAD GIVEN THEM THE IMPRESSION THAT THE U.S. WAS WILLING TO CONTEMPLATE SOME RED CROSS INVOLVEMENT IN FUTURE DISCUSSIONS, WHILE RECOGNIZING MEMBER STATES' FOCUS ON THE BWC NEGOTIATIONS. THEY STRESSED A CONCERN THAT ACADEMICS AND INDUSTRIALISTS WORKING WITH BIOLOGICAL AGENTS WERE INSUFFICIENTLY AWARE OF WEAPONS RISKS AND GC OBLIGATIONS.
