1. Major [redacted]

(S) I have been asked to comment on the job and mission performance of [redacted] during his deployment as the OIC of the HAT supporting [redacted]. It is difficult for me to comment or evaluate the performance of an O-4. This is not the duties or responsibilities of a CW3, especially since I was not informed by Clarendon what his duties and responsibilities were. However, I will comment on my personal observations of [redacted] character and actions that he accomplished while serving in support of OIF. b1 per DoD b3 10 USC 130b b6 per DoD

Stateside [redacted] took charge of the HAT team preparing for deployment ensuring that each of its members assimilated, became familiar with each other in order to develop a necessary cohesion. He provided us with information for deployment processing and acted as the liaison between Col Crawford and the deploying HAT team. [redacted] took the lead in obtaining and delivering approximately 100 weapons into the AO and ensured that they arrived at their required destination. Arriving approximately one day prior to three other team members, the Maj. secured housing for the team at Camp Slayer so that there was a location for us to sleep while we tried to locate the TF we were to support.

Upon arrival at the TF, I began to operate on night shift and only had the opportunity to see the Maj. during a 3 hour time frame. I understood the Major's responsibilities to include ensuring that follow on HAT members arrived at our facility. This was accomplished with the arrival of two more personnel. Additionally, I understood that he was reporting back to Clarendon a status report about our personnel, equipment and any administrative or logistical needs. Finally, he was preparing an assessment of the HAT team mission and asset utilization for DHS. I am aware that he went to Fallujah to address some equipment needs, conduct accountability, and continue part of his assessment.

I had no special needs or requests for [redacted] during his tour of duty. I believed and still believe that he was being directed by Clarendon and that he was performing his duties as directed. However, I never questioned what his mission was or how he was accomplishing it. I have had no reason to believe that he was derelict in any of his duties. I believe [redacted] is an honest officer that performed his duties as directed. He struck me as a straight forward individual accomplishing a mission under very difficult conditions. These conditions were based on some previous actions of DHS personnel prior to our arrival. b3 10 USC 130b b6 per DoD

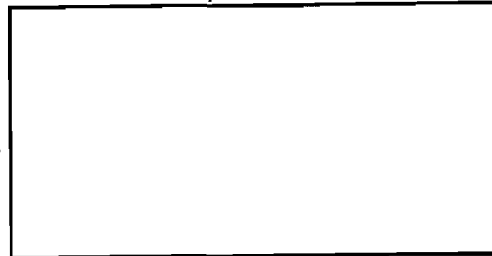
